

Superscoring the ACT is when you take the best subscores from multiple test dates (i.e the best English, best Math, best Reading and best Science) and take a NEW average for the composite score. Are you wondering what colleges and universities superscore the ACT? I was too, and I could not find a list that was up-to-date or accurate. I found out this information from either contacting colleges via email or from each college's website. As of February, 2020, it is updated with schools that superscore the ACT.
